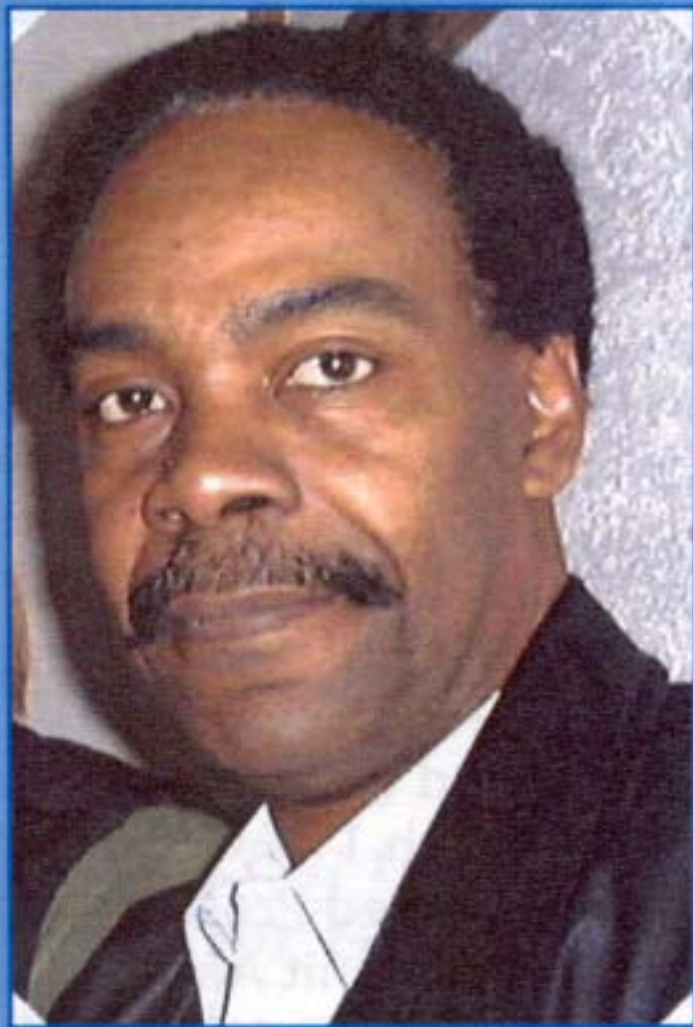

Glen Hawkins was born 15 June 1947 in Washington D.C. He retired after more than 25 years service for the US Air Force on May 4, 1992 as a Senior Master Sergeant.

While on active duty, he completed two tours in Vietnam. After retirement from the military, he worked as a System Administrator and a Logistics Management Specialist for the Assistant Chief of Staff, G4, Headquarters V Corps in Heidelberg, Germany.

In August of 1996, he began working for Defense Supply Center Philadelphia European Region and in December 2000, he was promoted to the the position of Chief, Information Technology.

He is survived by his wife, Christiane, a son Ryan (age 14), and a daughter Vanessa (age 8).
